## 1. General information about the course

The course is provided by the University of Skövde and is named English: Oral Presentation Techniques G1N (Engelska: Muntlig presentationsteknik G1N). It comprises 7.5 credits and is a first-cycle course. The level of progression is G1N.

The course is a part of the subject of English. The disciplinary domain of the course is The Humanities.

## 2. Entry requirements

General entry requirements (with exception of the requirement of Swedish).

Further requirements: English 6 (or the equivalent).

The level of English proficiency is normally shown by an internationally recognized language test, e.g. IELTS or TOEFL.

## 3. Course content

The course comprises teaching and training in presentation techniques as well as debates and discussions. The students carry out a number of prepared oral presentations in front of the rest of the group and participate in a variety of oral communication training as well as actively listen to others' presentations and give feedback verbally and in writing afterward.

## 4. Objectives

After completed course the student should be able to:

- utilise general and knowledge-based vocabulary
- apply elementary phonetic and grammatical rules in their oral proficiency
- give formal oral presentations of knowledge-based material, from a critical perspective
- use the language in different contexts, for example in presentations, debates, negotiations and argumentation
- comprehend spoken language in different contexts, for example in presentations, debates, negotiations and argumentation
- reflect on one's own and others' presentations by giving feedback to other students and discussing the carried-out assignments

## 5. Examination

The course is graded A (Excellent), B (Very good), C (Good), D (Satisfactory), E (Sufficient) or F (Fail).

The examinations of the course consist of the following modes of assessment:

- **Individual assignments 1**  
3 credits, grades: G/U
- **Individual assignments 2**  
4.5 credits, grades: A/B/C/D/E/F (determines the final grade)

Students with a permanent disability who have been approved for directed educational support may be offered adapted or alternative modes of assessment.

## **6. Types of instruction and language of instruction**

The teaching is comprised of seminars/group discussions and lectures.

The teaching is conducted in English.
